Grover Beach City Council to Discuss Traffic Calming, Safety Measures, and Reducing Roadway Widths

GROVER BEACH, CA — The Grover Beach City Council will consider future street rehabilitation, traffic calming improvements, and safety measures of Long Branch Avenue, Newport Avenue, Oak Park Boulevard and North 4th Street at a Special City Council Meeting on **Tuesday, April 12, 2016 at 6:00 p.m.** in the City Hall – Council Chambers, 154 South 8th Street, Grover Beach. The discussion will focus on the evaluation of options for reducing roadway widths on Long Branch and Newport Avenues.

Community input is requested regarding future rehabilitation and traffic calming improvements, specifically for Long Branch and Newport Avenues, both of which are wider from curb to curb than the City's standard residential streets. The primary benefits of reduced street widths include reducing the overall amount of maintained pavement (i.e., reducing costs), traffic calming (i.e., reducing vehicle speeds), and providing options for the filtration of storm water and constructing landscape areas for beautification / enhancement.
