Grover Beach City Council Sets Workshop to Gather Community Input on Street Rehabilitation and Repair Program

GROVER BEACH, CA — The Grover Beach City Council is inviting residents and businesses to attend and participate in another workshop to gather public input for the Street Rehabilitation and Repair Program. Thanks to the voters' authorization, the City will sell up to \$48 million in bonds to fund the undertaking of a major project to repair and rebuild local streets. The City Council is seeking citizen input on criteria that could be used to select candidate streets. According to Mayor Shoals, "The public workshop is a great opportunity for community members to learn about the street rehabilitation program and to give input on the prioritization factors that will be used to develop the strategy for street repairs in the city. We want to hear from the community."

The last workshop in a series of public outreach meetings during the month of February will be held:

Monday, February 23, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. Ramona Garden Park Center 993 Ramona Avenue, Grover Beach

The format for this workshop will be interactive and attendees will be asked to weigh in on prioritizing several factors for the selection of streets, including repairing more frequently used streets, repairing streets important for public safety, and repairing streets in the vicinity of local schools, as well as organizing street repair by area or land use (i.e., commercial, industrial or residential).

For anyone unable to attend the workshops, an online community survey is posted on the City website at www.grover.org and the City Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/groverbeach. A printed version of the survey is also available at the customer service counter during regular business hours at Grover Beach City Hall, 154 South Eighth Street. Completed surveys will assist with the measuring of the criteria and should take less than five minutes to complete.
